

Existing Celebratory Plaques to women in and around Nottingham

1. **Constance Shacklock** – bar in Theatre Royal blue plaque put there by BBC Music and British Plaque Trust - Opera singer born in Sherwood
2. **Alma Lucy Reville** – blue plaque now behind the counter in St Ann's Library? – Screenwriter, film editor and wife of Alfred Hitchcock, born in St Ann's
3. **National Council of Women of Great Britain** – in St Mary's Church in the Lacemarket; celebrating the first meeting of this group in the Vestry on 26.10.1895
4. **Helen Kirkpatrick Watts** – in the Arboretum granite slab + plaque put there by NWHG in 2018 - Suffragette
5. **Mary Howitt** – double bust with husband William - was at Nottingham Castle colonnade now relocated to Newstead Abbey? - writer
6. **Henrietta Carey** – hexagonal stone at 455/457 The Wells Road on 2 homes placed there in her memory in 1926 unfortunately now almost unreadable – Social reformer and founder of Nottingham Town and County Social Guild
7. **Dame Laura Knight** – brown plaque on 9 Noel Street the family home - Artist
8. **Dame Agnes Mellors** – St Mary's Church – plaque commemorating the 500year anniversary - Founder of Nottingham High School
9. **Florence Paton MP**– sculpture in Carlton Park marking her as Nottinghamshire's first woman MP
10. **Hilda Dowson** - blue plaque at the Grange, Radcliffe on Trent, unveiled on 23.08.19 by WW1 & Local History Group - Suffragist

- 11. Helena Brownsword Dowson** – blue plaque on Justice Centre put there by Nottingham Bench, Magistrates Association and NWHG in November 2020—leading suffragist, Magistrate, and City Councillor
- 12. Ada Lovelace** – blue plaque unveiled on Ada Lovelace Day 8.10.2019 by Discover Ashfield celebrating her pioneering mathematical and computing.
- 13. Constance Mabel Jeans** – commemorative plaque unveiled in 1920 by the Public Baths Committee at Portland baths to celebrate her unprecedented swimming performance – gives details - All England and Olympic swimmer
- 14. Minnie Trease** – commemorative plaque in All Saints Church celebrating her lengthy service as Guide Captain of the 11th Nottingham (All Saints) Company from 1917-1949
- 15. Dorothy Crewdson** – commemorative plaque in Lenton Holy Trinity to her service as a nurse in WW1 she died of peritonitis and is buried in Etaples. She is also on the Lenton War memorial near Albert Ball cottages
- 16. Dorothy Whipple** – blue plaque on 35 Ebers Road celebrating her novels 6 of which were written there.
- 17. First Women in Politics** – info board mounted on the side of the Council House opposite Exchange Walk celebrating the first women Councillors, Mayors, Sheriffs and MP's – put there as part of City Council event for International Women's Day March 8th 2020
- 18. First 3 Women Magistrates** – info board on the Justice Centre celebrating the first 3 women appointed to the Nottingham City Bench in 1920. Put there by the Magistrate Association and the Nottinghamshire Bench and NWHG on 20th July 2020
